As you know, our colleagues in the Southeast and Mid-Atlantic will grapple with Hurricane Helene's devastation for many months and years. News outlets are reporting more than 100 deaths, and countless others are still unaccounted for across the region. The historic storm surge levels, strong winds, and extreme rainfall have impacted six states. Many lack transportation networks, power, water systems, communications, and more.

# To Those Responding

First and foremost, to the emergency managers working around the clock to stabilize and recover, YOU ARE making a difference and helping people on their worst days. The strength, support, fortitude, and dedication you continue to show your communities and organizations is extraordinary – and nothing short of heroic.

#### Florida

<u>Florida Division of Emergency Management</u> – The storm update page includes press releases, Executive Orders, disaster assistance forms, a state assistance line, recovery resources, SNAP Program food replacement information, county emergency management information, sheltering information, price gouging reporting, business resources, WiFi hotspots, evacuation information, closures, and more.

## Georgia

<u>Georgia Emergency Management and Homeland Security Agency</u> – The storm update page includes state of emergency notices, how to report damages, crisis cleanup information, a list of local EM agencies, shelters, state parks open to evacuees, lodging, how to locate loved ones, and more.

## **North Carolina**

North Carolina Department of Public Safety – The storm update page includes emergency declarations, crisis cleanup information, open shelters, power outages, county storm updates, flood mapping, road conditions, DEQ situation report tracking, and much more.

#### South Carolina

<u>South Carolina Emergency Management Division</u> – The division's home page is tracking Hurricane Helene efforts, including news updates, shelters, ways to help, road conditions, closings, power outage reporting, and more.

## **Tennessee**

<u>Tennessee Emergency Management Agency</u> – The storm update page includes news releases, shelter information, volunteer information, status reports, how to donate, and more.

# Virginia

<u>Virginia Department of Emergency Management</u> – The storm page includes Executive Orders, press releases, recovery FAQs, a state public inquiry line, a local emergency management directory, and more.
